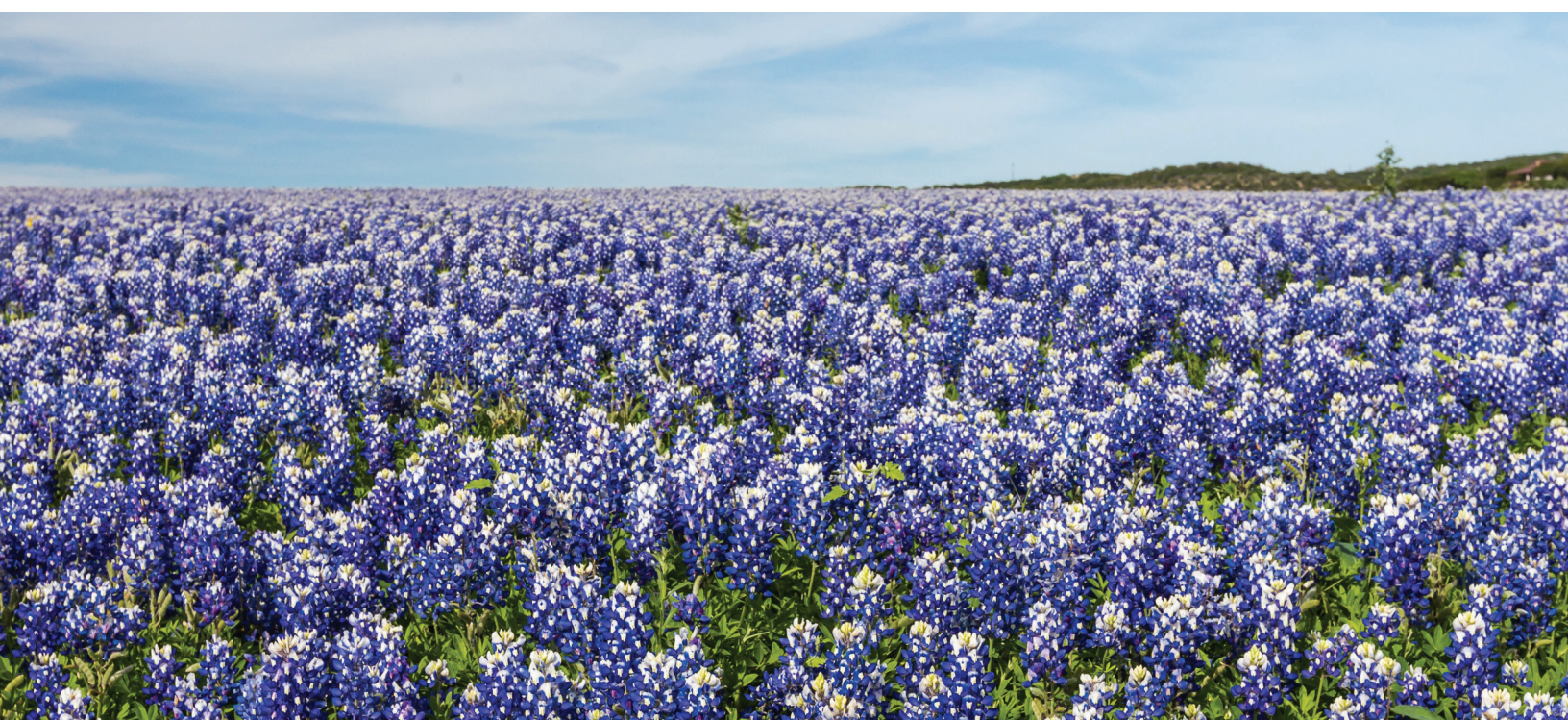

Sherrill Park Golf Course

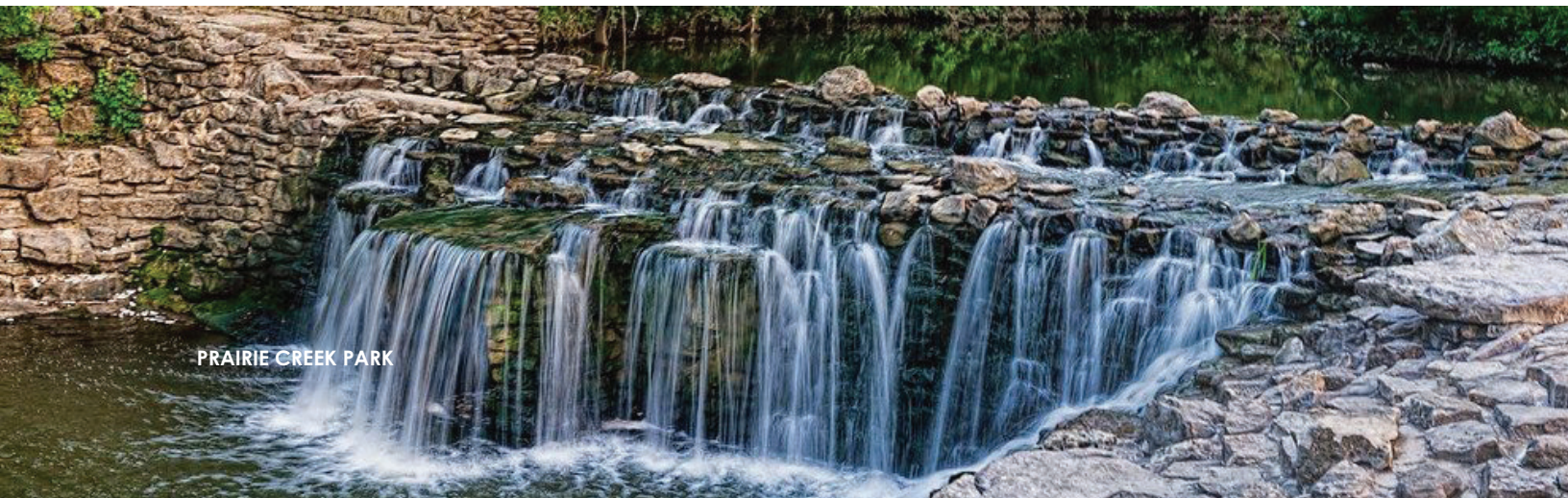

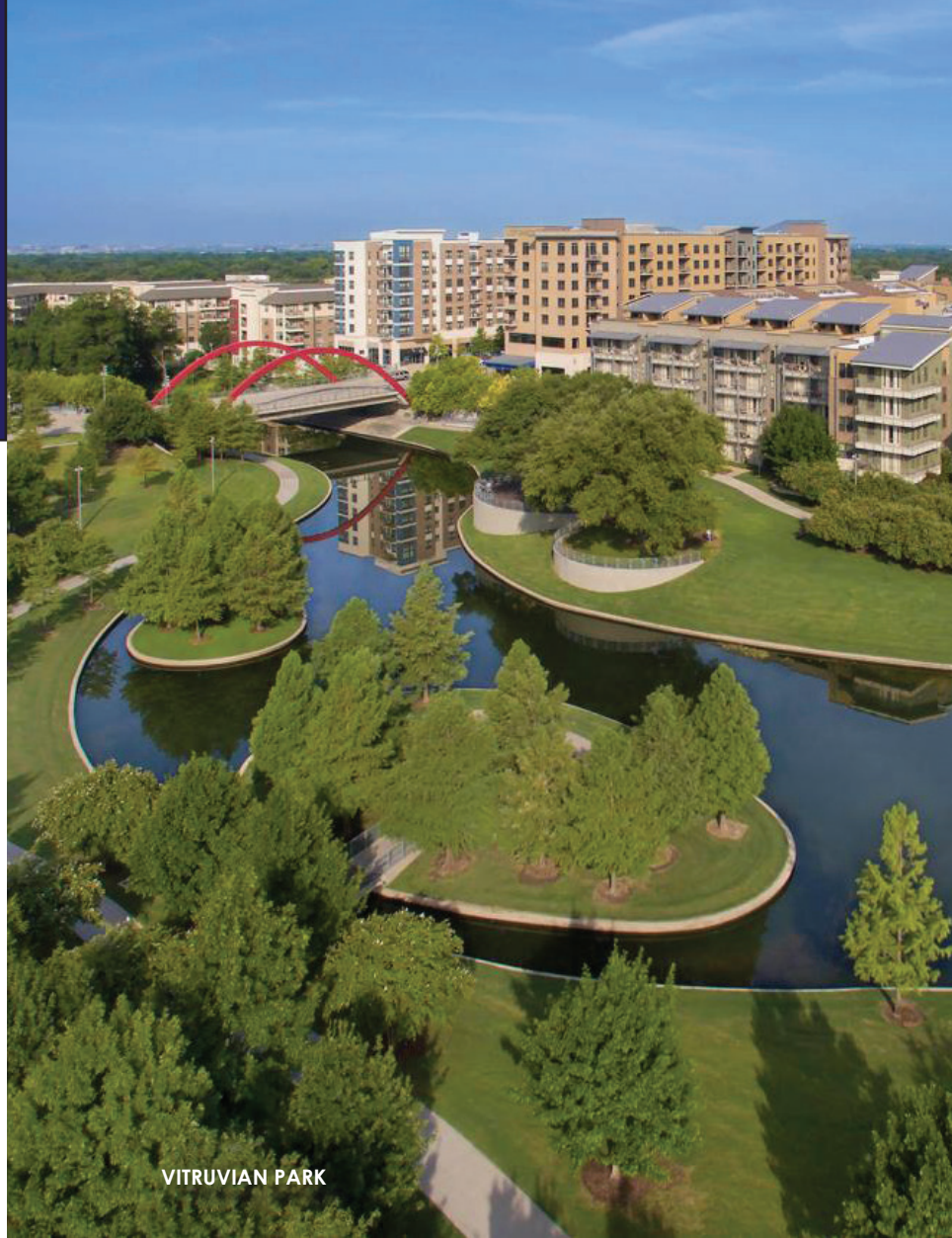
